Our Religious Education and World Views this Half Term

We will also consider how the teachings and practices that are expected in sacred places can be applied to our individual lives as well as how the concept of sacred places applies to atheists or those who identify as agnostic.

How can you help at home?

Times tables - Rehearsing the times tables as you journey to school, when tidying up, driving in the car or when getting ready in the morning, will all help to strengthen the children's times table recall which is used in all areas of maths learning.

Reading - Reading at home, both fiction and non-fiction texts, will support children's vocabulary understanding (especially new and exciting words) and inference - identifying clues to detect information that's not obvious. The team would love to hear what exciting vocabulary you have found and what books are capturing the children's interests. Don't forget to log these reads on Go Read and leave a review to earn gems!



Year 5 - Summer Term 1 2022 - Why does the world rely on rivers?

Important facts to know by the end of this topic:

- The start of a river is called the source and the end is called the mouth.
- Many rivers and streams will join together before they reach the mouth of the river. The smaller rivers and streams are called tributaries.
- Isle of Wight rivers include the River Medina, Newtown Creek and Eastern Yar.

British rivers

- **Thames** London river that is 184 miles long.
- **Severn** Britain's longest river (220 miles) running from Wales to Bristol.

Key Skills

- **Locational knowledge** will be developed as we use a variety of maps including OS maps to identify our country' and county's rivers.
- Developing our knowledge of the parts of the river, how rivers are formed and how the water cycle keeps our rivers flowing will deepen our physical geographical knowledge.
- Considering how people use rivers, how the world relies on rivers and what impact it has on where settlements are established will further our geographical skills of human geography and skills and fieldwork.

Key Vocabulary

- **Mouth** - A river mouth is the part of a river where the river flows into another river, a lake, a reservoir, a sea, or an ocean.
- **Source** - The source of a river is where it begins, usually on high ground.
- **Meander** - A meander is a winding curve or bend in a river.
- **Tributary** - When one stream or river meets another and merge together, the smaller stream or river is known as a tributary.



Our English this half term!

Finishing last half term with our top secret mission at the Alex Rider base camp in the Wye Valley and graduating with some of the best recruits they have ever seen, we will be applying our experiences this half term.

Our Maths this half term!

This half term we are continuing to deepen the children's understanding of fractions - applying their four operations learning from earlier in the year. We are then moving into decimals and percentages with the children learning how to convert between these three.

We also have some more hands on maths with co-ordinates, reflecting and translating shapes on a graph and even some, great fun if not rather wet, capacity lessons.
