This half term we will be exploring stories of Justice. Within this we will be looking at the law, as well as comparing stories of justice from different religions (specifically from Christianity and Islam).

How can you help at home?

Reading - Reading unlocks everything around your children - it is so important that children have an understanding of what they have read as well as being able to read individual words. To support, try asking your child to summarise what they have read independently. Our expectation is that pupils are to read at home at least three times a week and that these reads are recorded on the Go Read app.

Maths - Race your child to see who can answer multiplication facts quickest or try using problem solving questions to do with money (when shopping) or measurements (when cooking).

Writing - Ask your children the skills that they have been developing in Speedy SPaG (our daily routine) and encourage them to show off these skills in their written homework.

Homework - Homework will be set on a Tuesday and due in the following Tuesday. As always, best presentation is expected.



Year 5 - Spring Term 2 2023 - Why does the world rely on rivers?

Important facts to know by the end of this topic:

- The start of a river is called the source and the end is called the mouth.
- Many rivers and streams will join together before they reach the mouth of the river. The smaller rivers and streams are called tributaries.
- Isle of Wight rivers include the River Medina, Newtown Creek and Eastern Yar.

British rivers


- **Thames** London river that is 184 miles long.
- **Severn** Britain's longest river (220 miles) running from Wales to Bristol.

Key Skills

- **Locational knowledge** will be developed as we use a variety of maps including OS maps to identify our country' and county's rivers.
- Developing our knowledge of the parts of the river, how rivers are formed and how the water cycle keeps our rivers flowing will deepen our physical geographical knowledge.
- Considering how people use rivers, how the world relies on rivers and what impact it has on where settlements are established will further our geographical skills of human geography and skills and fieldwork.

Key Vocabulary

- **Mouth** - A river mouth is the part of a river where the river flows into another river, a lake, a reservoir, a sea, or an ocean.
- **Source** - The source of a river is where it begins, usually on high ground.
- **Meander** - A meander is a winding curve or bend in a river.
- **Tributary** - When one stream or river meets another and merge together, the smaller stream or river is known as a tributary.



Our English this half term!

Our book this half term is 'The London Eye Mystery,' which tells the story of how Ted investigates the mystery of how his cousin, Salim, seemingly vanishes from inside a sealed capsule on the London Eye. We will get to know the main character Ted through our inference and deduction skills and use this knowledge to write a detailed character profile. We will be reporting on Salim's mysterious disappearance by scripting and performing our own TV news bulletins.

Our Maths this half term!
