Our Religious Education and World Views this Half Term

This half term in Christianity we are focusing on the concept of temptation. Children will learn what it is, explore their own experiences about being tempted and link this with Jesus' temptation in the wilderness. Finally, they will learn about how to resist temptation as best they can.



<u>Reading</u> - Please take time to read with your child at home as much as you can. We expect them to read at least 3 times each week at home which should be recorded in their reading log. This will be checked every Friday.

<u>Maths</u> - Times tables - our aim is for all children to receive all of their times tables badges by the end of Year Four up to x12. We also have to undertake the Year 4 multiplication check in June 2022. See if you can practise at home. Play with money - sort, count, add, subtract, play shops - every little helps!

Important facts to know by the end of this topic:

- The Victorians had a big impact on the UK in terms of the laws and how we deal with crime and punishment.
- A lady called Mary Carpenter reformed how offending children were punished she believed they should be taught skills to stop them from reoffending.
- Today, prisons are categorised and are very different from Victorian prisons.
- In 1838, Parkhurst was a prison for children with around 600 boys being held there.
