


How do we promote Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural learning at Nine Acres Primary?

Through our everyday teaching and our creative Cornerstones curriculum, the Living Difference R.E curriculum and HIAS PSHE curriculum, all teachers plan and deliver lessons that equip children to be thoughtful, caring and active citizens in school and the wider community.



Our children have a broad and balanced curriculum that promotes Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural development across all year groups that includes:

- Educational visits
- Philosophy for children lessons in Years 3, 4 and 5.
- Extending learning outside of the Classroom
- We learn to ask thoughtful questions and value the opinions of others in all lessons.
- We have visitors in school that allow us to understand our wider community, for example our Citizen to Citizen project with a group of veterans.

Learning how to look after animals by having ducklings hatch in EYFS.




We have an on site Child and Family worker who works closely with our families and children to support with any difficulties.



Our Moral Learning

- Assemblies on: Cyber-bullying, Road safety, British values and democracy, Prevent Duty
- We hear the pupil voice by having an established Pupil Leadership Team who vote on important school decisions. For example, they developed our school values.
- Mufti days to raise money for charity.
- School values system, where the emphasis is on showing how we value everyone and what they contribute to school life.
- We are actively involved in Poppy selling and have received an award of achievement for this from the British Legion.

- From EYFS, all children receive weekly German lessons where children not only learn how to speak, read and write in German but children also gain an understanding of a different way of life.



- We host Belgium students in Spring term.


- Our school value of Citizenship means we are proud of our school and our community and everyone in it. We love learning about our local and national community.
