Year 4 - Spring Term 2 2023 - Anglo Saxons

Important facts to know by the end of this topic:

- The Anglo-Saxon age in Britain was from around AD410 to 1066.They were a mix of tribes from Germany, Denmark and the Netherlands.
- The three biggest were the Angles, the Saxons and the Jutes. The land they settled in was 'Angle-land', or England.
- By 900 AD they had established five powerful kingdoms (Wessex, Mercia, East Anglia, Kent and Northumbria)
- Life for people in Anglo-Saxon England was very much dependent on their position in society.
- During the Anglo-Saxon time, the Isle of Wight was called 'Wihtwara' named after Wihtgar, an early Anglo Saxon King, and was part of Wessex.

Our English this half term!

We are studying the classic C.S. Lewis novel - The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe. Children will write recounts of events from another character's point of view, which will lead to them writing their memoir in our first journey. In the second writing journey, they will work towards retelling the story, which requires a lot of skills and knowledge of the text. To make this learning fun, children will have participated in drama activities to help them get to know the characters even more.
