Year 4 - Autumn Term 2 2022 - How did the Romans Army shape our life in Britain today?

Important facts to know by the end of this topic:

- The Roman army were established and they first conquered mainland Italy and then the territory around them.
- Boudicca's, the Iceni Queen's rebellion against the Roman invasion was unsuccessful, but made her a heroine in her people's eyes.
- Hadrian's wall came to mark the border between the empire and the Picts in Scotland. The Romans attempted to expand further by building the Antonine wall which was situated further North. It was abandoned shortly afterward when the legions withdrew.
- The legacies the romans left include roads, coins, calendar and sanitation.
- Significant person study: Julius

Ruler - somebody who governs a state or nation, e.g. a sovereign.


Artefact - an object made by a human being, especially one that has archaeological or cultural interest.
