By now you should have received your new home learning pack for the next two weeks. The staff have taken on board lots of your feedback through the personal phone calls to tailor the learning for your child. Next week the staffing team will be reviewing the learning packs that the children have handed in. They will provide feedback for you and



your child and this will be emailed to you by Friday 29th January. We want you to share this with your child so they know how proud we are of them and which areas they can continue to work on. They are used to this type of feedback from the way we work in school especially those pupils in KS2 who take part in our half termly pupils conferencing and target setting. We will of course follow up with them in our routine phone calls.

In addition we have also sent you the details of our new offer for the children at home to join us virtually for a few sessions a week. Attached to this newsletter is an 'Acceptable Use Agreement'. Please take the time to read through. If you do not consent for your child to take part in the live sessions then please email the office on <u>office@nineacrespri.co.uk</u> and we will discuss an alternative plan for your family. Next week, we have scheduled a quick 15 minute session to enable us to check everything is working and say a virtual 'hello' and for the children to see all their friends. The next session and ongoing sessions will have a writing focus as we know this was the biggest challenge we faced in the last lockdown. The teachers will teach a writing aspect and set your child a writing task to be revisiting in the following session. We have looked carefully at the timetables to try to avoid any clashes with families who have children in more than one year group so devices at home can be used fairly. Parents will receive a text informing them of their child's session time next week.

I would like to THANK all those families who have sent in messages of support and kindness to all our staffing community. The staffing team are all true heroes in my eyes and as frontline workers in this pandemic your understanding and support is very humbling.

Make the most of this time together, life is very busy but now is the time to remember just what you have and celebrate the uniqueness of your family.
