

Dear Families,

I have thoroughly enjoyed receiving several emails from parents of photos this week of our children being inspired by their learning. We have had video's of children doing extra reading, family reading times, maths in bed and even volcanoes on a Saturday! Your children inspire us to the best teachers we can be. Thank you for sharing those precious moments with us - please do keep sending them in so we can celebrate with the children!

Next week is National Poetry Week so we will be sharing lots of lovely poems with the children - I would really enjoy seeing any they chose to write at home as a result - please send them in with your child to share with their class.

Also over the past few weeks the teachers in KS2 (Year 3 to Year 6) have been conducting 'pupil conferencing' with your child. This is a dedicated time for the teacher and your child to chat about their learning and set themselves targets to aim for. Please chat to your child about their 'blue folder' and how they are using this in class to work on their individual areas.

You will see that from Monday our staff will be wearing face shields when collecting the children from the playground and dismissing them to you at the end of the day. We have had to look carefully at our procedures and work with the photography company to ensure this is completed as safely as possible therefore we are unable to offer sibling photos at this time. I am sorry but I hope you enjoy the individual photographs just as much. You will receive a text with your child's photograph day - please ensure they are dressed in their normal smart uniform!

Have a lovely weekend - just one more thing.... please can every child have a named coat in school as the weather is turning and we want to get the children outside in the fresh air as much as possible!



Dear parents and guardians,

This is an important letter to share some information on how we can work together to make sure we can continue to give children and young people the best education in the safest way possible.

One important part of ensuring the safety and wellbeing of pupils, parents and our communities is testing for coronavirus. We all have a duty to make sure that the right people have access to get tested at the right time. Every time a test is used inappropriately, a person with Covid-19 symptoms may miss out on getting tested.

Therefore, I ask that you all follow these principles:

- You should only book a test if your child has any of these three coronavirus symptoms:
 - a high temperature: any new high temperature where your child feels hot to touch on their chest or back (you do not need to measure the temperature)
 - 2. a new continuous cough: coughing a lot for more than an hour, or three or more coughing episodes in 24 hours
 - a loss of, or change in, sense of smell or taste: a noticeable loss of smell or taste or things smell and taste different to normal
- Your child does not need a test if they have a runny nose, are sneezing or feeling unwell but do not have a temperature, cough or loss of, or change in, sense of smell or taste because these are not normally symptoms of coronavirus.
- If you are unsure about whether to get a test, please check the official list of symptoms on the NHS website, which is reviewed regularly: www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/symptoms/
- Only the person with symptoms should get a test. You do not need to get a test
 for anyone else in the household unless they also have any of the three
 symptoms listed above. All members of the household need to self-isolate whilst
 waiting for the test result.

- If the person with symptoms' test comes back positive, other members of their household should continue self-isolating for 14 days and only get a test if they develop coronavirus symptoms.
- If a pupil in a class or bubble tests positive for coronavirus, anyone who is advised to self-isolate does not require a test unless they subsequently develop symptoms.

No one else in the same class or bubble as the symptomatic person needs to take any action unless advised by the school. Schools have detailed guidance and access to a Department for Education and Public Health England helpline for advice and support.

Contacts of a person who has tested positive must follow the guidance carefully and in full, which means they must stay at home for 14 days. This is because it can take several days following contact with an infected person before an individual develops symptoms or the virus can be detected. Students should only book a test if they get symptoms.

It is vital for children's learning and future opportunities that they are able to return to school and college. It is therefore vitally important that all we work together and do our bit to make this possible.

Results from 2019...

- KS4: Our GCSE Progress 8 score of +0.12 places us in the top third of schools nationally.
- **KS4**: Progress score places us as the top school on the Isle of Wight and in the top quarter of all schools in the Hampshire and IoW region.
- KS4: All our core subject departments are in top third of schools nationally, and our Maths progress score of +0.33 places us in the top sixth, nationally.
- KS5: Average grade of C and point score of 31.59 places us in top third of schools and colleges nationally.
- KS5: Percentage of students achieving A-level AAB or higher in at least two
 facilitating subjects (commonly needed for entry to leading universities) was
 27%, placing us top of all schools and colleges in the Hampshire and IoW region,
 and in the top 6% nationally.
