<u>Maths</u> - Homework with key questions will continue this half term mirroring the learning that has been taking place in school. Please speak to one of us if you would like us to share with you how we teach it in school.

History – This is a time to develop your independent study which will then help them understand areas they are learning about in class - something that they will need to do to support your learning in secondary school. Your child may want to complete research at home to help gain knowledge about the Vikings; how they lived; what evidence of them in Britain today.

Year 6 - Spring Term 2 2023 - Vikings

Important facts to know by the end of this topic:

□ Longships were designed to sail in both deep and shallow water so that they could get close to the shore and sail in rivers to get inland.

The most important Viking British city was York, or Jorvik as it was known by the Vikings.

Vikings were pagans and often raided monasteries, looting gold.

□ Not all Vikings were warriors. Many came in peace and become farmers.

□ The lands that the Vikings occupied were known as Danelaw.

□ No Vikings wore horns in their helmets.

Key Skills

To have a chronological understanding of British history and the impact it

has had on our language and to make inferences about a period of history from the words they contributed

- To describe what a stereotype is and how this has changed over time.
- To use primary and secondary sources to learn about the first Viking contact with Britain.
- To learn more about the Vikings as traders as well as raiders.
- To place features of historical events and people from the past in a chronological framework.



<u>Archaeologist</u> People who discover our history by looking at artefacts that have been found.

<u>Raids</u> A sudden armed attack with the aim of causing damage rather than occupying any of the enemy's land.

<u>Vicious</u> To be intentionally harmful or nasty. Vikings warriors were known to be vicious.

Longhouse A large hall-like building where many Viking families would live together.

Berserkers Warriors that went to war wearing wolf or bear skins. They were out of control and charged fearlessly. The word 'berserk' came from it.

<u>Scandinavia</u> The name given to a collection of countries: Denmark, Norway and Sweden.

 $\underline{\textbf{Danelaw}}$ The name given to lands in Britain occupied by the Vikings.

<u>Misconception</u> This means mis-understanding. In Viking terms there were many misunderstandings about the Vikings.

Odin One of the most famous Viking Gods known for wisdom.
