## Theme

As we continue our Frozen Kingdom topic, we will be focusing on our Geography skills. How do people survive and thrive in the world's most barren landscapes? We will be creating our very own survival guides for the Polar Regions. Would you like to experience what its like to live in these cold climates? We will finding out all about these Scandinavian countries of Denmark, Norway, Sweden, Finland, Iceland and Greenland. And as we learn more about the terrain, climate and physical features of each country, we will create travel brochures to tempt others to visit this beautiful part of the world. How do you feel about the devastating consequences of Global Warming? Can we do anything about it? We will be writing Persuasive speeches to help the world realise and understand the effect of climate change of our planet.

To end our topic, pupils will give a three minute presentation to their class about a famous explorer they have researched at home.

Have you ever wondered how ice if formed then disappears? In Science we will be looking at Properties and Changes of Materials. We will investigate materials that dissolve in liquid to form a solution. We will demonstrate that dissolving, mixing and changes of state are reversible changes while some changes result in the formation of new materials, and that this kind of change is not usually reversible, including changes associated with burning.
