EYFS - Summer Term 1 2023 - Living Things!

Key learning this half term:



- Living things breathe air, move or grow and need food and water.
- Some animals hatch out of eggs.
- A life cycle is the different stages that a living things goes through in its life.
- Plants have different parts such as a stem, roots and leaves.
- Plants need water, sun and food to grow.

Key Skills

- Talking about the human lifecycle and how we have changed
- Applying this knowledge to animal and plant life cycles
- Differentiate between animals which have live births and those which come from eggs
- Know facts about the Isle of Wight and agriculture
- Know how to care for plants and animals to help them to grow

Key Vocabulary

Growth - something that has grown or is growing.

Change - a process through which something becomes different.

Life cycle- the different stages a living thing goes through in its life.

Hatch - when an egg opens and produces a young animal.

Live birth - the birth of a child or animal that isn't born from an egg.

Roots - the part of a plant which grows under ground and absorbs water.

Stem - the main stalk of a plant.

Leaves - the part of a plant which makes food from sunlight.

Agriculture - the process of farming animals or plants for food.

Our English this half term

We will be following several stories based around the theme of 'Growing', and use these to develop our knowledge.

Following the story of Hattie Peck, children will learn about eggs, design a way of keeping them safe, and receive eggs to hatch in an incubator.

When learning about growing plants, we will explore Oliver's Vegetables and Errol's Garden, as well as looking at non-fiction texts to learn more. We will write instructions for how to grow and care for plants. We will continue to learn more graphemes, and focus on applying these in our writing.

Please ensure that your child is reading at least three times a week and this is logged on Go Read. One of these can be an independent read.
