


Year 3 - Summer Term 1 - My Locality and Beyond

Important facts to know by the end of this topic:

By the end of this topic we will be able to locate countries and other localities on a map. They will be able to give grid references for a place and find places using grid references.

We will be exploring different maps of the Isle of Wight, satellite images and Google Earth to compare the different representations.

The Isle of Wight used to be called Southern Vectis as Vectis means island.

There are nine main towns on the Isle of Wight.

The Isle of Wight is the twelfth biggest island within the British Isles but has the fourth biggest population.

Key Skills



Field work

- To use maps to locate countries
- To use grid references on a map.
- To use basic ordnance map symbols.
- To use geographical words to describe a place.

Key Vocabulary

Ordnance survey — Ordnance Survey is the national mapping agency for Great Britain.

Key — The key has symbols to tell you what things on the map mean.

Compass — A compass is a tool to tell you which direction you are facing.

Direction — North, East, South, West.

Latitude — the distance North or South of the equator measured in degrees.

Longitude — distance measured in degrees east or west of a line that runs down the earth.

This half term we are first focusing on revising our knowledge of fractions, and measurement.



Next we will be investigating.....TIME! We will be learning to tell the time to the nearest minute, looking at analogue and digital watches, months in the year and AM to PM.
