PSHE this Half Term

This half term we will be talking to the children about how they can keep themselves safe. We will discuss what is safe to go on their bodies and go in to their bodies. We will look at what they can do to keep themselves safe online and people who can help keep them safe.

Physical Development this Half Term

Our PE day is a Monday and our first session with our PE specialist will be on **Monday 6th November**. Children will need to wear their PE kit for the day every Monday. In PE we will be exploring different ways of moving. We will a have a go at hopping, skipping and jumping. We will also explore kicking and catching!

How can you help at home?

<u>Reading</u> - Please read at home with your child at least 3 times a week! Please discuss the cover, who the characters are in the story, what is happening and what might happen next. Please play the games we have sent home regularly until your child can confidently complete them independently.

 $\underline{\text{Maths}}$ - Please support your child to recognise and count numbers up to 5. Talk about what 1 more and one less of a particular number. Explore with your child how numbers up to 5 are made up of smaller numbers. 2 add 3 equals 5, 4 add 1 equals 5.

<u>Wider Curriculum</u> - Talk to your children about the different seasons, and the characteristics of them. Encourage your child to talk about celebrations, past and present events, different traditions and routines! Explore how stories are sequenced with a start, middle and end and try acting out and retelling stories.

EYFS - Autumn Term 2 2023 - How people have different beliefs?

Important facts to know by the end of this topic:

What the four seasons are, and key characteristics of them such as winter is



cold, and in Autumn the leaves fall off the trees.

- What Diwali and Christmas is, who celebrates them, and the traditions around these celebration.
- Know and compare other celebrations and traditions, explore their similarities and differences.
- Traditional tales are stories that have been told for many years.

Key Skills



- Continue developing positive attitudes about the differences between people.
- Recognise that people have different beliefs and celebrate special times in different ways.
- Engage in extended conversations about stories, learning new vocabulary.
- Listen to and talk about stories to build familiarity and understanding.



Retell the story, once they have developed a deep familiarity with the text, some as exact repetition and some in their own words.

Key Vocabulary

Diwali: the festival of light, celebrated mostly by Hindus. There are lots of fireworks, lights and sweets.

Christmas: a traditional celebration mostly celebrated by Christians, this is to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ.

Change: to make different, or not the same as before.

Traditional Tale: a story that has been told and re-told for many years.

Character: a person or animal in a story.

Sequencing: arranging in a particular order.

Seasons - four different times of the year, which are names Winter, Spring, Autumn and Summer.

Our English this half term!

We will be exploring traditional tales!

We will be learning the stories of The Little Red Hen, The Three Little Pias, The Gingerbread Man and The Nativity. We will retell these using actions and repeating key phrases and wordings from the story. We will be doing some very exciting activities such as making bread and aingerbread, meeting some of the characters from the stories and investigating crime scenes.

We will continue learning our Phase 2 sounds, and will advance with our reading and writing of CVC words. Your child will continue to bring home a sound book containing the new sounds they have learnt, as well as their reading books and records.
